Explore the intersection of art, science, and restoration ecology and add STEAM to your summer in this week-long training created especially for art educators!

- Learn about rain garden ecology, ecological restoration, land history and the role art plays in shaping our environmental attitudes.
- Learn to use natural materials and field methods in painting, drawing, and other media that can be applied to existing sites and restoration projects at your school.
- Hear guest artists talk about their nature-inspired work and demonstrate place based projects and activities.
- Take field trips to nearby established school sites to see art integration in action and engage in hands-on artmaking and restoration activities.
- Collaborate with colleagues and learn from experts about methods and resources that will help you connect the outdoor classroom with the art room.



EARTH PARTNERSHIP promotes native habitat restoration as a process for community learning and land stewardship. EP curriculum is based on a 10-step ecological restoration process in which school and communities identify their shared stewardship vision and how they can make it a reality.

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Nature-based artist and environmental educator Janet Moore will provide educators with a unique opportunity to integrate the EP curriculum and philosophy with art programming.
